


## Monument book burning

### **General information**

#### Общая информация

This empty library is there to remember the book burning from the year 1933 when professors and students of a national socialist alliance burned over 20 000 books of socially critical authors, journalists, philosophers and academics, especially Jewish authors. That book burning had a big influence on the Jewish community. The intention of the alliance was to prevent the influence of socially critical authors on the German culture, literature and science.

**Type:** monument/memorial

#### Location:

- in the centre of Berlin (Germany)
- "August-Bebelplatz"(today) near the "Deutsche Oper" (opera in Berlin)

Year of construction: 1994/1995

**Constructor:** Micha Ullman (\*1939) → Israeli artist and professor

not only in Berlin, but also in Munich or Hamburg etc.

## **Appearance form & effect**

Форма и эффект внешнего вида

Size: 5x5x5 meters > narrowed down

**Color:** white room with blue frame > Israeli flag, white = emptiness, peace

empty shelves > mysterious

underground room > deep

- a missing piece

# Inscriptions Надписи

"That was but a prelude; where they burn books, they will ultimately burn people as well."

Heinrich Heine 1820

- → Jewish background
- → one of the most famous poets, writers, and journalists of the 19th century
- → some of his work got burned too



Information:

"In the middle of the square on 10 May 1933, Nazi students burnt the works of hundreds of independent authors, journalists, philosophers, and academics."

- bronze plates, in the ground
- two inscriptions, each one placed some meters away from the monument
- contains information and two quotes
